With a new Strategy on the Rights of the Child, the Commission is addressing persistent and emerging challenges and proposing concrete actions to protect, promote and fulfil children's rights in today's ever-changing world. This Strategy draws on the contributions of over 10,000 children from the EU and beyond.<sup>1</sup>

## Children say they want to...



**...be active citizens and members of democratic societies**

*"If not us, then who."  
(16 year-old boy, Romania/UK)*



**...have an equal start in life**

*"School lets you open up to the world and talk to people. School is life."  
(child seeking asylum, France)*



**...be free from abuse, violence and anxiety**

*"I wish there were fewer fights and tensions in my family."  
(child, Greece)*



**...be listened to in legal proceedings**

*"Child-friendly justice is a child surrounded by a system in which he/she is protected/listened to/safe."  
(17 year-old girl, Romania)*



**...have equal access to safe online learning and play**

*"I didn't have a computer, the internet didn't reach my village, I didn't have any data and...I had to repeat."  
(15 year-old girl, Spain)*



**...live a life free from fear and war, everywhere**

*"I wish to see my town. Our homes were destroyed, there are no houses standing still anymore. (...) There was nothing here, there were no schools except for tents."  
(9 year-old girl, Syria)*

- set up an EU Children's Participation Platform;
- include children as agents of change in the implementation of the Climate Pact and the European Green Deal.



of the world population are children

- set up an EU Children's Participation Platform;
- include children as agents of change in the implementation of the Climate Pact and the European Green Deal.

of EU children are at risk of poverty or social exclusion



- set up a new European Child Guarantee for children in need;
- support efforts towards affordable and accessible healthcare, healthy nutrition, psycho-social support, education and leisure activities.

- seek to address domestic and gender-based violence, and harmful practices against women and girls;
- strengthen integrated child protection systems.

Out of 119,400, 2,850 were unaccompanied

- support the training of justice professionals on child-friendly justice;
- work with the Council of Europe to implement their 2010 guidelines on child-friendly justice.



In the EU experienced disturbing content online once a month in 2020

- step up the fight against online child sexual abuse and make service providers detect and report inappropriate content online;
- adopt an updated Better Internet for Kids Strategy in 2022.
